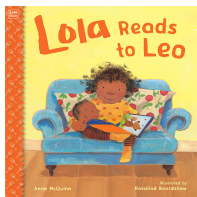


Books about Sibling Kindness



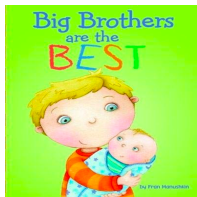
Snow Sisters! by Kerri Kokias

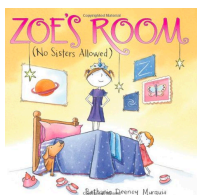
Tea Rex by Molly Idle

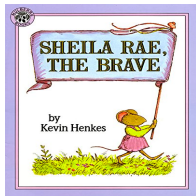


Zoe's Room (No Sisters Allowed) by Bethanie Murguia

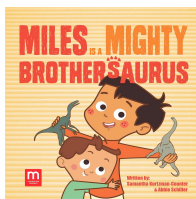
Sheila Rae, The Brave by Kevin Henke

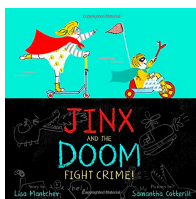
Maple & Willow Together by Lori Nichols

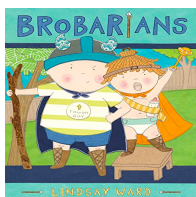
Miles is a Mighty Brothersaurus by Samantha Kurtzman-Counter & Abbie Schiller
